Branch/Section

RevenueSA, through the Commissioner of State Taxation, is responsible for the management, collection and enforcement of South Australia's taxation revenue, management of various grant schemes, management and collection of the fixed property component of the Emergency Services Levy (ESL); and management of government rebate incentive schemes.

The revenue collected (apart from ESL which specifically funds the provision of emergency services), is used by the Government to fund the provision of essential services including public health and safety, education and law and order for South Australian citizens.

Working together to deliver contemporary and innovative revenue and grant services for the benefit of South Australia.

As part of RevenueSA, the Compliance Services team contributes to these responsibilities by the achievement of specified revenue targets from programs of compliance activity across all the taxlines administered by RevenueSA. The conduct of these compliance programs not only achieves a gain to revenue, their conduct also has an emphasis on encouraging voluntary compliance, education of clients on their responsibilities and broadening compliance enforcement.

What this role is responsible for

- The Taxation Investigator Grade III is responsible to a Manager Audit, Compliance Services or Senior Taxation Investigator for carrying out audit, investigation and enforcement duties to monitor and enforce compliance with State Taxation legislation. Prepare reports and briefs as appropriate. Gather statistics as required. Obtain evidence for assessment and prosecution in respect of breaches and attend court as required.
- The Investigator is also required to inform taxpayers in the private sector, of RevenueSA policy and their liabilities, in order to encourage their compliance and to provide a high level of taxpayer service.

Contribute to the successful achievement of Compliance Services business objectives by:

- Individually, or as part of a team, undertaking audits, investigations and enforcement activities in respect of the affairs of members of the private sector, in order to monitor and enforce compliance with RevenueSA legislation.
- Informing taxpayers in the private sector of RevenueSA policy and their liabilities, in order to encourage and facilitate their compliance and to provide a high level of taxpayer service.
- Preparing written reports and briefs regarding the findings, for assessment, together with recommendations and advice re amendment to policy/legislation or if prosecution is warranted.
- Gathering and collating statistics as required.
- Obtaining evidence either by conducting interviews, overtly retaining/seizing records or through covert surveillance, for assessing or prosecution in respect to breaches of legislation. Attending court and giving evidence as required.

Who this role reports to

The Investigator Grade III is responsible to a Manager Audit, Compliance Services (ASO-8) or Senior Taxation Investigator (ASO-6) for the conduct of complex audits, investigations and enforcement activities undertaken by the Branch. The Investigator may be required to undertake the role of project leader, where a number of officers are required to complete the task and to assist in training.

Key Relationships/Stakeholders

- RevenueSA Executives, Leadership team and RevenueSA and Compliance Services colleagues the role supports and represents.
 - Taxpayers (individuals & businesses) and their representatives.
 - External stakeholders – other government agencies, accounting and legal firms, financial institutions and property agents involved in enforcement.
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Special Conditions

- Applicants will be required to undergo the appropriate and relevant employment screening assessment(s) required for this role in line with the department's Employment Screening Policy.
 - This role requires:
 - National Police Check
 - Working with Children Check
 - Security Clearance (including Baseline, Negative Vetting Level 1 or Level 2, Positive Vetting)
 - Other:
 - Some out of hours work may be required. Intrastate and interstate travel may be required.
 - The incumbent will be required to participate in the Departmental Performance Management Program.
 - The incumbent may be required to be assigned to other positions at the same remuneration level across the department.
 - This position may be offered on either a full-time or part-time basis. Salary will be adjusted accordingly.

- An understanding of the legislative requirements of the *Work Health and Safety Act 2012*.
- An understanding of and ability to work/manage to the spirit and principles of AS ISO 31000:2018 Risk management – Guidelines.
- Demonstrated capacity for clear, creative and analytical thinking to undertake casework and the ability to self-motivate and to work successfully under limited direction to meet deadlines.
- Proven investigative ability to ascertain the substance of transactions behind the legal form.
- Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively both verbally and in writing at various levels in the public and private sectors.
- Commitment to provide quality in audit, investigation and enforcement work and to operate in a professional manner.
